

## Ps. 91:1–6


- 1 He that dwelleth in the secret place of the most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty.
- 2 I will say of the Lord, *He is* my refuge and my fortress: my God; in him will I trust.
- 3 Surely he shall deliver thee from the snare of the fowler, *and* from the noisome pestilence.
- 4 He shall cover thee with his feathers, and under his wings shalt thou trust: his truth *shall be thy* shield and buckler.
- 5 Thou shalt not be afraid for the terror by night; *nor* for the arrow *that* flieth by day;
- 6 *Nor* for the pestilence *that* walketh in darkness; *nor* for the destruction *that* wasteth at noonday.

## Ps. 18:2, 3, 6

- 2 The Lord *is* my rock, and my fortress, and my deliverer; my God, my strength, in whom I will trust; my buckler, and the horn of my salvation, *and* my high tower.
- 3 I will call upon the Lord, *who is worthy* to be praised: so shall I be saved from mine enemies.
- 6 In my distress I called upon the Lord, and cried unto my God: he heard my voice out of his temple, and my cry came before him, *even* into his ears.

## Ps. 71:1–3

- 1 In thee, O Lord, do I put my trust: let me never be put to confusion.
- 2 Deliver me in thy righteousness, and cause me to escape: incline thine ear unto me, and save me.
- 3 Be thou my strong habitation, whereunto I may continually resort: thou hast given commandment to save me; for thou *art* my rock and my fortress.

quaint themselves intelligently with God.



**SH 260:13**

**Ps. 91:7–13**

7 A thousand shall fall at thy side, and ten thousand at thy right hand; *but* it shall not come nigh thee.  
8 Only with thine eyes shalt thou behold and see the reward of the wicked.  
9 Because thou hast made the Lord, *which is* my refuge, *even* the most High, thy habitation;  
10 There shall no evil befall thee, neither shall any plague come nigh thy dwelling.  
11 For he shall give his angels charge over thee, to keep thee in all thy ways.  
12 They shall bear thee up in *their* hands, lest thou dash thy foot against a stone.  
13 Thou shalt tread upon the lion and adder: the young lion and the dragon shalt thou trample under feet.

27 The eternal God *is thy* refuge, and underneath *are* the everlasting arms: and he shall thrust out the  
enemy from before thee; ...

**Ps. 46:1, 5, 7 (to 1st .)**

- 1 God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.  
5 God is in the midst of her; she shall not be moved: God shall help her, *and that* right early.  
7 The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge. ...

**Ps. 62:5–8 (to 1st .)**

- 5 My soul, wait thou only upon God; for my expectation is from him.  
6 He only is my rock and my salvation: *he* is my defence; I shall not be moved.  
7 In God is my salvation and my glory: the rock of my strength, *and* my refuge, is in God.  
8 Trust in him at all times; ye people, pour out your heart before him: God is a refuge for us. ...

**SH 83:6–9**

- 6 Science only can explain the incredible good and evil elements now coming to the surface. Mortals must find refuge in Truth in order to escape the error of these latter  
9 days.
